East Park Arboretum

Tullahoma, Tennessee

908 Country Club Drive

The City of Tullahoma was selected by the Tennessee Department of Agriculture, Forestry Division to receive Tennessee Agricultural Enhancement Program community tree planting matching grants in 2015 and in 2016. The trees acquired by these grants and by private donations made it possible for the City to create the East Park Arboretum which is certified as a Level II Arboretum containing greater than 60 tree species. In the spring of 2013, the City partnered with the Tullahoma Sunrise Rotary Club to build an 18 hole Disc Golf Course in East Park. Sunrise Rotary funded the kiosk, tree identification signs, tee pads and the baskets, and the City cleared fairways and built bridges. The Course architectural plan specified installation of about 30 trees. In 2015 the Tullahoma Tree Board and the City Parks and Recreation Department applied for and were awarded a Tennessee Agricultural Enhancement Program community tree planting matching grant. The trees were then planted in East Park, completing the Course architectural plan. A second grant was awarded in 2016; these trees were interspersed throughout East Park Golf Course. The Tullahoma Tree Board and the City applied to the State for recognition of the first tree planting project as an Arboretum. This was approved by the State designated arboretum certification organization, the Tennessee Urban Forestry Council, on April 20, 2016, as a Level I arboretum. On April 27, 2017, the Council certified East Park Arboretum as a Level II Arboretum.
