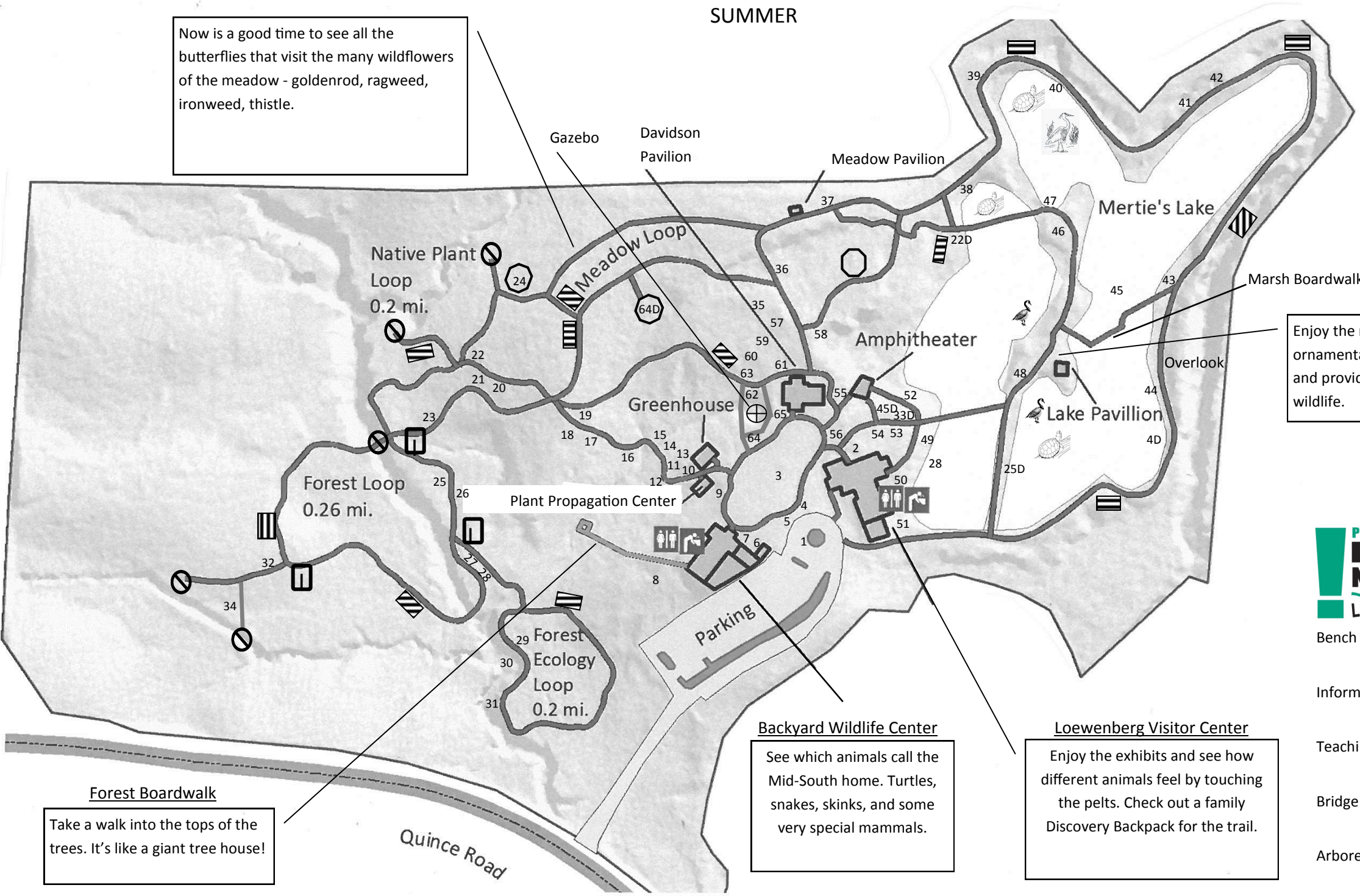


SUMMER

The *Site Guide* explores the walking trails through our three habitats and identifies over 60 trees native to the MidSouth. Other highlights include the:

- **Loewenberg Visitor Center** featuring natural science exhibits focusing on the MidSouth of the past and present.
- **Backyard Wildlife Center** housing native animals from the lake, meadow, and forest habitats.
- **Davidson Pavilion**, a sheltered place for group picnics, field trips, and social events.
- **Amphitheater**, for outdoor programs.
- **Greenhouse and Plant Propagation Center**, home of Lichterman's native plant propagation program.
- **Special Events Lawn** edged with native plant demonstration gardens.
- **International Paper Family Discovery Backpacks** *FREE* at Guest Services with tools, guides and activities for trailside fun.
